
Honouring our history and traditions

IN 1962, THEY OPENED THEIR FIRST HOME FOR THE AGED, KNOWN AS 'BEAUFORT HILL' IN CLAYFIELD.



WITH THE HARD WORK OF PAT DOBE, NAN DOBIE, MARGARET LAVARING, KATH MARSHALL, FRAN SMITH, AUDREY TOGNE AND OTHERS, THE ORGANISATION RELOCATED TO THIS SITE AND OFFICIALLY OPENED STAR GARDENS IN 1993. THE ORGANISATION LATER BECAME KNOWN AS STAR AGED LIVING LTD.

IN 2018, STAR GARDENS (NOW WHIDDON BEAUDESERT STAR) WAS SOLD TO WHIDDON, ALLOWING THE ORGANISATION TO FOCUS ON GREATER CHARITY AND BENEVOLENCE AS THE EASTERN STAR (AUSTRALIA) FOUNDATION LTD.
